"An Attitude of Pastoral Care" Update

In the first part of this year the Leadership Advisory Team has been working on implementing the plan for pastoral care called "An attitude of pastoral care". The first stage is well under way with the "Pastoral Care Referrals" team formed and beginning to consider how it will best go about its ministry. This will be rolled out in the coming months. The second stage is a bit slower to get off the ground as it is proving difficult to find people to form the "Pastoral Care Learning Group". The details of the group are as follows:

Purpose: To facilitate the WHUC community's learning in relation to pastoral care.

Goals:

- a) Help every person to understand that pastoral care is everyone's responsibility: both in the giving and in the asking for/seeking care
- b) Encourage ALL groups to develop a plan for pastoral care within the group and beyond
- c) Encourage communication between groups about how they approach pastoral care
- d) Resource groups and individuals in their approaches to and practices of pastoral care

Who: This group will include the Minister of the Word and at least three others.

If you have any suggestions of who might be good to approach to consider being a member of the group, please let Isabel Greenall know.

Wesley Centre

2018 saw the Wesley staff working hard on promoting the Wesley Centre through a number of marketing avenues including a new version of our Fact Sheet and Brochure and were busy networking with other members of the community. After consulting with local GP's a decision was made to subsidise the gap fee for any client who has a Health Care Card and Mental Health Care Plan from the 1st June. The Anger Management Program and our relationship with Corrections continued to grow and receive great feedback. 2019 sees the Wesley Centre branch out further into the Mental Health field with a view to offering Dual Diagnosis Counselling. This will complement other areas already included such as; Relationship and Family issues; Grief, loss and bereavement; Depression; Anxiety; Trauma; Anger Management and Stress Management. Our counsellors are highly experienced and our fees are based on a sliding scale. We can be contacted directly or receive referrals from other agencies. You will be supported to cope, grow and heal in an environment that nurtures you and protects your privacy and dignity.
