You probably feel a bit like Peter! No one washes my feet!!!! You probably feel that way because we keep our feet covered up with socks and shoes, and anyway, in Jesus day, the feet were the symbol of work and travel. When you came home at night, someone washed your feet, someone you paid, if you had the money, a domestic employee.

Hands are the symbols of work and being in our world. So when you come in, there will be a bowl of water, and a towel. We wash each other's hands. It says "I serve you in the name of Christ!". It says "I accept your gift, in the name of Christ, and I pass it on to another!" The grace of Christ is given that we might give.

And all through the service, that feel of washing, the cool of the water, rests in your hands, and as you leave. Christ be with you, we say, and He is.

In that same room, in the intimacy that only great moments and great love can generate, Christ tells his disciples, I share my very life, my body, my blood with you, for soon it
