For us, Easter Day is the beginning of Easter. For us, Easter season runs for the next five Sundays until Pentecost on the 23rd May, It is traditionally the time when we reflect on what Easter means for us, for the world. If Christ is risen, then our whole cosmology is called into question. Death is not the final word; Easter is. So what does it mean if we apply that radical idea to everything we experience? That's the Easter question, and it's what we are doing over the next five Sundays as we travel with the disciples through that 50 day passage of time, from Easter to Pentecost.

What does Easter mean for you, what you think about life, what you think about creation, what you think about purpose? Have you ever consciously thought about it? Are you ready to think about it again? I hope in this Easter season, until May 23rd, you will.

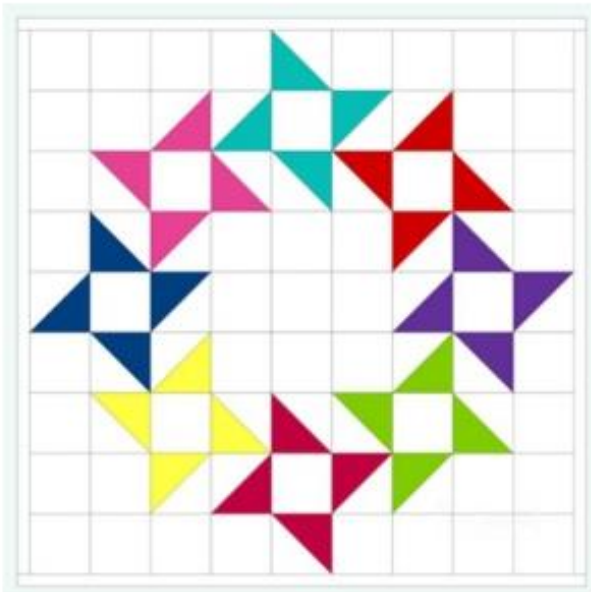

JOHN 20:19-31

¹⁹ When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' ²² When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.' ²⁴ But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.'
