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

STATEMENT FROM CHURCH COUNCIL TO CONGREGATIONAL MEETING ON SUNDAY 18TH MARCH, 2018

Since September 2017 the Finance Committee and Church Council have been working on the 2018 -2020 budget due to the unsustainable financial situation at Western Heights Uniting Church.

At the Annual General Meeting in February a draft budget was presented showing three key changes:

A decrease in giving by the congregation

A decrease in Mission & Service Giving to the work of the wider church of the Synod of Vic-Tas. An increase in finances needed for works on the Manse.

The budget was still in substantial deficit and therefore unsustainable.

Taking into account the direction of the strategic plan and the resources available in the congregation, followed by consultation with staff, it was resolved by the Church Council "that the position of Lay Ministry Worker – Pastoral Care Coordinator be made redundant." According to the second year of the strategic plan, as a congregation we are to "develop new approach to pastoral care that is more diverse and engages members/groups in this ministry". This approach can be effective without the Pastoral Care Co-ordinator position.

The Church Council confirms that "we recognise and appreciate the wonderful contribution that Audrey has made to the life of WHUC and its associated ministries over 7 years. It is with great regret that this decision had to be made."

Summary of Minutes of Church Council (CC) Meeting

Wednesday, 21 February, 2018

- 1. DEVOTIONS: Growing Together by Velma O. Ephesians1: 1 14. We are
- blessed with every spiritual blessing. Therefore, we are able to do that which grows us into maturity. God gives us each other for support and to help us grow together.
- 2. As a result of catering done at Wesley by some of our ladies, we received a donation of \$500 for outreach. \$200 will be used towards the school holiday tennis program and \$300 towards the WH Secondary College Breakfast Program.
- 3. A grant of \$9000 has been received from 'Street Smart'. This is to be used solely to help homeless people in various situations. The money will be dispersed as needed.
- 4. CC elections will be held in May.
- 5. CC formally re-adopted and signed our 'Statement of Commitment to Keeping Children Safe':

We are committed to implementing the Keeping Children Safe Policy of the Uniting Church in Australia, Synod of Victoria.

All children who are involved in any of the Uniting Church's activities, services, events or programs have a right to feel and be safe.

We are committed to providing safe environments where children are cared for, respected, nurtured and sustained. We have zero tolerance of all forms of child abuse and will do all in our power to safeguard children from abuse. We are committed to creating and maintaining a child-safe culture to ensure the care, protection and safety of all children engaging with the Church in any of its entities.

Abuse thrives on secrecy. To prevent child abuse across the Church, we are committed to providing clear leadership and open and transparent governance to combat secrecy.

We clearly affirm the Church's commitment to upholding the law. This includes the requirement to report abuse to the appropriate authorities.

We commit to the following actions, as appropriate in our situation, to keep children safe:

- Promote strong leadership and governance and a culture of child safety
- Promote access, equity and diversity
- Promote appropriate behaviour amongst adults and children
- Recruit, train and supervise workers well
- Manage risk, promote safety and respond to concerns
- Promote child, family and community participation.
