Uniting Care changes

The Standing Committee of the Synod at its June meeting approved a new strategic direction for the Uniting Care agency network, affirming the Church's ongoing role in the delivery of community services as an expression of God's mission in the world. This strategic direction reflects the Church's motivation to respond in compassion to human need. These changes have been initiated in order to continue to care for people in current and future contexts. The new strategic direction changes overall governance of community services provided within the Uniting Care Victoria and Tasmania network from the Commission for Mission board to a new single governance body ('agency board'). This new body will oversee delivery and support functions for Uniting Church community services in Victoria and Tasmania. All Uniting Care agencies have been informed of this strategic direction. Synod Archives is relocating

The synod's Victorian archives service will be relocating from Orrong Road, Elsternwick to Serrell Street, Malvern East later this year.

The relocation of the service is part of a wider redesign of the archives operation for the synod in Victoria.

A new archivist has recently been appointed. With the continued support of the volunteers, the archives service will open a number of days a week to process materials and handle research requests when relocated to the new facility in August or September.

The current archives site at Orrong Road, Elsternwick, was sold at auction on Friday 5 June. All net proceeds from the sale of the property will contribute to the upfront costs of the relocation and ongoing funding of the archive operations.

The archives service continues to operate as normal during this period of transition. The date for the relocation of the service and new operating hours will be settled in the coming weeks.

Vision Sisters Fundraiser!

Did you know...that every hour, 33 women still die from pregnancy or childbirth complications. In Uganda, almost half of all pregnant women give birth without the assistance of a skilled health worker, often in unclean conditions that threaten the lives of both mothers and babies. So...this term our playgroup is going to support the fundraising efforts of world vision and will be raising money to assist mums in Uganda!



Giving birth shouldn't be a matter of life or death

World Vision works around the world to improve maternal and child healthcare. In Uganda, we are training health workers and encouraging women to give birth in a health clinic. World Vision also partners with the Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia) to provide health clinics with clean birthing kits so that mothers and babies can avoid infection and survive childbirth.

What is a clean birthing kit?

A clean birthing kit is so basic that it costs less than a cup of coffee. Yet it can help prevent infection and save lives. One birthing kit costs \$3!

Each birthing kit contains six items needed to ensure a clean delivery:

Pas toral Care

Pastoral Care is a term closely linked with Christianity. What is it and how is it provided here at Western Heights?

First written about by Pope Gregory I around the year 590AD, in a treatise on the responsibilities of the clergy, you could ask 10 people what it means and receive 10 different answers.

Originally a term relating to the ministry of care and counselling provided within and by the Christian Churches it is also more broadly seen today as the practice of looking after the personal and social well-being of people within an organisation whether religious or not. Such care includes a wide variety of issues including health, social and moral education, behaviour management and emotional support.

Traditionally, a distinctive feature of the Uniting Church has been the proactive provision of pastoral care of its members. It is a phrase regularly used at Western Heights but do we all have the same understanding of what it means?

At last November's Pastoral Partners' training session, open to all within the congregation, the following draft definition of pastoral care was formulated:

Jesus calls all of us to care for others.

Pastoral Care is a ministry of "presence", based on our faith and prayer, providing support to those in need.

Pastoral Care is a journey shared, with each other and God.

What was seen in 590AD as the responsibility of the clergy is understood in 2015 at Western Heights as the responsibility of **all** within the congregation. It is provided in a variety of ways, formal and ad hoc, proactive and reactive. The depth to which that care goes tends to be relative to the training of the 'provider'. In summary care is currently provided by:

The Ministry Team of Isabel, Audrey & Karen

<u>Pastoral Partners</u> – people trained in the provision of pastoral care. Each has a specific responsibility for a number of specific people in their "cluster"

<u>Small Groups</u> – Each member of the group is responsible for the care of the others within the group. Each group creates its own plan for the provision of care for each other.

<u>Buddies</u> – People who have been noted as providing an ad hoc means of maintaining a link between individuals and the congregation. A person's Buddy was often their Pastoral Partner before "retiring".

<u>The various groups within the congregation</u> such as Friendship Group, Friends from Vines, Messy Church, Contemplative Group, retirees Outings, Midweek communion, Mission outreach, etc

<u>Individuals</u> There are many quiet achievers providing supportive friendship to others within the congregation. Any time you think of another, pray for another, connect with another particularly with an attentive ear, you are providing pastoral care

As we seek to be a church that "cares for and responds to community and/or individual needs" we need to ask ourselves what can be celebrated about how we care for each other and ask what could we do better enabling us to develop a new approach to pastoral care that is more diverse and intentionally engages members/groups in this ministry.

who helped out!




KFG Bowling Night
