Pas **f**oral Care – Prayerful support

Many find prayer an enormous support in times of need, yet struggle to find the words especially when praying with or for someone else. When praying with someone it is important to ask what they are seeking prayer for. Whilst you might not use their words, you can then incorporate their thoughts and feelings into prayer. You may find the following selection a useful resource, adapting them for personal or shared use.

The Narrative Lectionary

Who & Why?

The Narrative Lectionary is a four-year cycle of readings. It was initiated in 2010 by Profs. Rolf Jacobson and Craig Koester of Luther Seminary, in partnership with congregations across North America. Though the Revised Common Lectionary has united the church in its reading of scripture and has given much-needed structure, it doesn't present scripture -- especially the Old Testament -- in a way that helps people to become fluent in the language of faith. The Narrative Lectionary is an attempt to take nine months to do just that.

What?

On the Sundays from September through May each year the texts follow the sweep of the biblical story, from Creation through the early Christian church. The texts show the breadth and variety of voices within Scripture. They invite us to hear the stories of Abraham and Sarah, Moses and the prophets, Jesus, and Paul. Listening to the many different voices within Scripture enriches worship together and the life of faith.

The texts include the major episodes in Scripture. They are arranged in a narrative sequence to help us see Scripture as a story that has coherence and a dynamic movement:

- From September to mid-December the texts begin with the early chapters of Genesis, move through the stories of Israel's early history, the exodus, the kings, prophets, exile and return.
- From Christmas to Easter there is sustained reading of one of the four gospels.
- From Easter to Pentecost the texts are chosen from Acts and Paul's letters.

Texts were selected that lead well to the proclamation of what God is doing. The stories tell of hope and disappointment, suffering and redemption. In all these varied contexts, we find God dealing with the complexities of human life. Stories from the gospels differ each year, avoiding repetition and highlighting what is distinctive about each gospel's telling of the story of Jesus.

The Church Year helps to shape the flow of the Narrative Lectionary. Old Testament readings move through the story of God's dealings with Israel and culminate in Advent with the prophets who speak of longing and hope. Readings from the gospels fit the movement from Christmas and Epiphany to the Transfiguration, Ash Wednesday, Holy Week and Easter. Selections from the book of Acts and Paul's letters trace the outward movement of the resurrection message, culminating on Pentecost with readings focusing on the Spirit.

The other three months?

Winter is the perfect time to delve deeper into the Bible with a sermon series. For Winter this year we did two sermon series: 2 Corinthians (6 weeks); Job (6 weeks).

The new Narrative Lectionary began this year on 11th September. Let's enjoy the journey through the Bible together!

Possible Small Group Study Series

At the annual synod meeting this year, Rev Dr Sally Douglas led the daily bible studies exploring the imaging and celebration of Jesus as the female divine in biblical writings. Videos of the four studies are available for personal learning or group discussion. Handouts for each study include quotes from early Christian sources and Sally suggests watching only one study at a time, and then taking some time to reflect and discuss what you have heard (rather than watching two or more of the studies in one sitting).
