# **Some Thoughts for moving Forward**

The decision by the congregation has been made and will be communicated to the Presbytery in May to assist in their discernment.

We are a community "loving God: growing together, partnering community and sharing faith" and so how we move forward together should reflect this. Following the way of Jesus involves caring for each other within the diversity of opinions and responses. It is not necessarily easy, but it is the way of Jesus.

Some questions/comments for us all to consider:

- ♦ How am I feeling now?
- Am I carrying any hurt, regret, anger, disappointment, guilt...?
- ...I beg you to live in a way that is worthy of the people God has chosen to be his own. Always be humble and gentle. Patiently put up with each other and love each other. Try your best to let God's Spirit keep your hearts united. Do this by living at peace. All of you are part of the same body (Ephesians 4:1-4a, CEV).
- True justice is not about taking sides, but about refusing to be enemies (Shane Claibourne).
- What can I do or need to do for the sake of my own health and well-being?
- What can I do to support the health and well-being of the congregation?

Let us pray that we can move forward with a spirit of respect, care, forgiveness and courage.

# Summary of Church Council Minutes of meeting held on 15 February 2017

## The formal minutes of this meeting still need to be approved at the next CC meeting on 19 April, 2017.

## CC Purpose Statement

"Church Council shall give priority in its life to building and supporting the church community in <u>Loving God</u>, <u>Growing Together</u>, <u>Partnering Community and Sharing Faith</u>. We will seek to sustain the church community and each other in hope and realise a fuller participation in Christ's mission in the world through fostering a culture of empathy, purpose, conversation and learning."

- 1. Graeme Hardy took devotions. It was based on Deuteronomy 6:5 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength'. Our love for God grows through prayer, reading his word, listening to his word.
- 2. 59 members of the congregation who require a WWCC because of the role/s that they fulfil at WHUC now have a valid WWCC and have been entered on the secure Synod database. CC commends the congregation for their cooperation in this matter.
- 3. A Child Safe Standards Task Group, as required by Synod, has been formed at WHUC. Karen Morgan, Gwyn Edwards, and Velma Oliver will be part of this Task Group.
- 4. A legacy of \$500 was left to Western Heights Uniting Church from the Coral Bourquin estate.
- 5. The Financial Report for the WHUC Fundraising a/c for the year ended 31 December, 2016, has been audited by Geoffrey Everett, as a fair representation.
- 6. The Year Two Strategic Plan has been adopted. This will be communicated in the monthly newsletter, the pew sheet and on the wall in the Horizons Room. The various MT's and groups of the church will be informed of the actions for which they are responsible in this year's plan. CC acknowledges and appreciates the amount of work done by Gwyn E, Peter M, Janet Pavlakis, Helen Sleep and Roger Dingle in formalising the Year 2 plan.
- 7. Adjustments have been made to the Congregational Roll and it is now up to date.
- 8. A Statement to the Congregation, in accordance with "Document 19 Protocols, Policies and Guidelines for Placements Committee Procedure for Extension of a Placement Beyond Ten Years" is being prepared by CC. This will be e-mailed or snail-mailed to all members of the congregation as soon as it is ready.
- 9. A "Welcome Statement" has been prepared for the use of all visiting worship leaders, i.e. persons other than Isabel G. The "Welcome" statement must be read at the start of each service at WHUC. This statement is in accordance with the UCA's Vision and Mission Principles: "Following Christ, walking together as First and Second Peoples, seeking community, compassion and justice for all creation." A copy will be left at the lectern.

# Synod Strategic Implementation News

A 16-page booklet Introducing the Vision and Mission Principles has been released by the Synod. The booklet, containing information and exercises, is the first of a series that explains elements of the overall Strategic Framework adopted by the Synod. The Framework describes how we are striving to respond as life-giving communities of faithful people and as people who serve the mission of God. The booklet is designed for personal reflection or within a congregation or group environment. It invites discussion, provokes questions and gives an intentional focus for discerning the renewing work of the Spirit in our day. Printed copies of Introducing the Vision and Mission Principles will be distributed during March and it is available as a PDF here. The Vision and Mission Principles and Statements of Intent are also being produced in languages other than English. This creates greater accessibility for conversations and discussions about the Strategic Framework and assists in fostering faith, deepening discipleship, partnerships and trust as we seek to act together across cultures.

Readers of March *Crosslight* should also have received a bookmark displaying the Vision and Mission Principles and Statements of Intent. This is yet another resource to help gathered communities become familiar with the Strategic Framework of our Synod. Joseph Camilleri OAM is Emeritus Professor at La Trobe University, Melbourne and Executive Director of Alexandria Agenda, a new venture in ethical consulting. In 2005 he founded the La Trobe Centre for Dialogue. Under his leadership, the Centre quickly established a national and international reputation for research, training and policy development. He is an internationally acclaimed author, having written 20 books and over 100 book chapters and journal articles. His research has centred on: international political economy; religion and culture; security and peace studies; foreign policies of the great powers and the Asia-Pacific region. Over the past 10 years Camilleri has convened some 20 major international dialogues and conferences, and appeared before several parliamentary and government inquiries, most recently the parliamentary inquiry into the Racial Discrimination Act.
