Culture of Safety Contact Person

At its meeting on Wednesday, 21 June, 2017, the Church Council was very happy to endorse Heather Rookes as our "Culture of Safety Contact Person". Heather is now part of the Safe Church Task Group consisting of Gwyn Edwards, Karen Morgan, Nola Bicknell, Steve Singline and Velma Oliver. Appointing a Culture of Safety Contact Person is part of what we, as a church, have to do in becoming a safe church. Heather Rookes will be our "GO TO" person, when anyone in the congregation has concerns about the safety of children in the congregation, or the welfare of vulnerable adults. Reports will be handled in confidence and there is a process, that needs to be followed, in place.

Summary of Church Council Minutes of meeting held on 17 May 2017

The formal minutes of this meeting still need to be approved at the next CC meeting on 21 June, 2017.

CC Purpose Statement

"Church Council shall give priority in its life to building and supporting the church community in <u>Loving God</u>, <u>Growing Together</u>, <u>Partnering Community and Sharing Faith</u>. We will seek to sustain the church community and each other in hope and realise a fuller participation in Christ's mission in the world through fostering a culture of <u>empathy</u>, <u>purpose</u>, <u>conversation</u> and <u>learning</u>."

- 1. Geoff Coots took devotions. Geoff spoke about the importance of "partnering community". He used examples from "Dear Lord, they want me to give the devotions". As Christians, we learn that we need to be loving, forgiving and caring of our community, just like Jesus.
- 2. Rodger M., Nola B., Velma O., Karen Morgan and Jan Grigg attended Child Safe Training at Wesley in Geelong on Saturday, 6 May 2017.
- 3. CC has adopted the "Keeping Children Safe" Policy. Hard copies of the latest version are available from Velma O. and electronic copies from Jan Grigg.
- 4. CC has adopted the "Statement of Commitment to the Keeping Children Safe Policy". A shortened version of this statement of commitment is on display in the foyer and in the Horizons Room. It will always appear on the front page of the pew sheet and the monthly newsletters.
- 5. CC has adopted the "Code of Conduct" as written in the Keeping Children Safe Policy. All holders of valid Working With Children Checks as well as teachers with VIT checks need to obtain a copy of the Code of Conduct from Velma O. and also sign off as having received a copy.
- 6. CC has adopted the "Culture of Safety Contact Person" role description.
- 7. Isabel G, and Gwyn E. will invite members of the congregation to form a task group to review the Ministry Team (MT) model, and change / develop as needed to support the Strategic Plan.
- 8. Gwyn E. has had a beneficial meeting with Suzanne Cooper from Diversitat. This is one of CC's actions in the Year 2 Strategic Plan, viz. "Explore a possible relationship with Diversitat".

The Culture of Safety unit is delighted to announce the launch of a dedicated Keeping Children Safe website http://ucavictas.org.au/keepingchildrensafe/. We hope that congregations will find this website helpful and easy to navigate. Thank you for your patience while we have navigated changing requirements of policy and legislation. We are grateful to the many Church Councils and individuals who are already doing excellent work to keep children safe in the Uniting Church. This website is designed to make it easier for congregations to meet their ethical and legal requirements regarding child safety.

UCA Working With Children Checks

All UCA congregations <u>are required by law</u> to ensure that the following members of the congregation have current Working With Children Checks (WWCC).

These include and is not limited to: Ministers, Lay Ministry Workers, Lay Preachers, Church Councillors, Worship Leaders, Music Leaders, Organists, Pianists, anyone commissioned by the Church Council to perform a leadership role, Bible Study Leaders, volunteers at Messy Church, those in leadership at Congregational Meetings. Volunteers at the Western Heights Secondary College Breakfast Program are also included.

Copies of the UCA letter from the General Secretary are available to all members of our congregation who are affected by this requirement. It is important that, if you are affected by this requirement, you get a WWCC or update your details immediately. Attached to this letter is a step-by-step procedure to guide those:

(a) needing to make application for a WWCC for the first time, and

(b) members of the congregation who are holders of current WWCC's and need to update their details.

Copies of the letter and the attached step-by-step guide are available from Velma Oliver.

The WWCC Regulations require Cardholders to update their details on the Dept. of Justice website. All locations where the person volunteers or is employed need to be recorded. Please update your details at http://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/home/cardholders/update+your+details/index.html. You must notify the Department of Justice and Regulation within 21 days of any changes to your personal, contact and organisation's details.

A very special thank-you to all our members who have already applied for and received a valid WWCC. These have now been entered onto the secure Synod database. Again, thank you. Velma Oliver
