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#### Summary of Church Council Minutes of meeting held on 20 September 2017 (Priority Business Meeting) ## The formal minutes of this meeting still need to be approved at the next CC meeting on <u>18 October, 2017.</u>

#### CC Purpose Statement

Church Council shall give priority in its life to building and supporting the church community in <u>Loting God, Growing Together, Partnering Community and Sharing Faith</u>. We will seek to sustain the church community and each other in hope and realise a fuller participation in Christ's mission in the world through fostering a culture of <u>empathy</u>, <u>purpose</u>, <u>conversation and learning</u>."

- 1. Peter Morgan took devotions and the topic was Partnering Community. He spoke about 'Relay for Life', a 24hour fundraising event for cancer. The participants repeatedly asked this question of one another: "Who are you relaying for?" One congregation set up church at the event. Both fine examples of pastoral care and partnering community.
- 2. Review of Ministry Teams: Structure and Recommendations:

a. That CC adopts the Review Team and Isabel's suggested structure, with the proviso that a Review Team is formed to "develop new approach to pastoral care that is more diverse and engages members/groups in this ministry". (Year 2 Strategic Plan - Actions for Pastoral Care and Small Group Co-ordinators.) b. That research be undertaken by each MT as to their role.

- 3. Strategic Plan discussion, including minister's focus areas for the next 5 years: Recommendations:
- 1. That Rev. Isabel Greenall creates a profile of her remaining time at WHUC. This profile is to include: a. % of time spent on various aspects of her work.
- b. Aspects of her work that require more of her time.

## **UCA Working With Children Checks**

All UCA congregations <u>are required by law</u> to ensure that the following members of the congregation have current Working With Children Checks (WWCC).

These include and is not limited to: Ministers, Lay Ministry Workers, Lay Preachers, Church Councillors, Worship Leaders, Music Leaders, Organists, Pianists, anyone commissioned by the Church Council to perform a leadership role, Bible Study Leaders, volunteers at Messy Church, those in leadership at Congregational Meetings. Volunteers at the Western Heights Secondary College Breakfast Program are also included.

Copies of the UCA letter from the General Secretary are available to all members of our congregation who are affected by this requirement. It is important that, if you are affected by this requirement, you get a WWCC or update your details immediately. Attached to this letter is a step-by-step procedure to guide those: (a) needing to make application for a WWCC for the first time, and (b) members of the congregation who are holders of current WWCC's and need to undate their details

(b) members of the congregation who are holders of current WWCC's and need to update their details.

Copies of the letter and the attached step-by-step guide are available from Karen Morgan.

The WWCC Regulations require Cardholders to update their details on the Dept. of Justice website. All locations where the person volunteers or is employed need to be recorded. Please update your details at http://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/home/cardholders/update+your+details/index.html. You must notify the Department of Justice and Regulation within 21 days of any changes to your personal, contact and organisation's details.

A very special thank-you to all our members who have already applied for and received a valid WWCC. These have now been entered onto the secure Synod database. Again, thank you. Karen Morgan

# Pas **t**oral Care

### Dementia

Recent press articles have reported that dementia is second only to heart disease as the leading cause of death in Australia. Seen as an old person's disease it is <u>not</u> a normal part of ageing. Although more common in people over 65, people in their 40s and 50s can also have dementia.

What is dementia? Is it the same as Alzheimer's? How can we pastorally care for those living with dementia?

Dementia describes a collection of symptoms that are caused by disorders affecting the brain. There are many different forms of dementia and each has its own causes. The most common types of dementia are Alzheimer's disease, Vascular dementia, Parkinson's disease, Dementia with Lewy bodies, Fronto Temporal Lobar Degeneration (FTLD), Huntington's disease, Alcohol related dementia (Korsakoff's syndrome) and Creutzfeldt-Jacob disease.

Dementia affects not only thinking, but also behaviour and bodily functioning. The interference in brain function affects the person's normal social or working life.

TIPS FOR PASTORALLY CARING FOR THOSE LIVING WITH DEMENTIA

Speak clearly and simply using short sentences containing single comments or questions. Use visual clues like pointing to an item you're talking about. Remember that they are not necessarily deaf!

LISTEN Don't be afraid of silence or pauses in conversation. It can take 5 times longer for those living with dementia to process information. Listen for the feeling behind the words. Think carefully before responding. Remember that your reality is not necessarily their reality. Whilst you may not be able to see their reality, focus on "feeling their reality", asking how they are feeling about what they perceive is happening.

If asked a specific question, <u>be truthful</u>. At some level they are aware of the truth. Phrase responses that are truthful but don't remind them of a painful reality. (Someone won't be coming today instead of telling them that they've died) Engage with their feelings about the person or situation.

Accept their reality and don't contradict or argue with them. This may occasion feelings of shame which will last long after the words are forgotten.

Don't ask if they remember something or someone, even who is in the photo at their bedside. They may feel embarrassed at not being able to remember. Introduce the topic from your perspective, using Í, my, etc.

Offer to shake hands when arriving and leaving. This is a non-intrusive way of offering touch which can be therapeutic

Select a space that has minimal distractions and interference. Sit or stand so that you are at their level, making eye contact with them.

Be aware of how your body language may be interpreted. Crossed arms may be misinterpreted as anger. Unless the topic is serious, remember to smile.

If you're aware of favourite prayers or bible readings, offer to read with them.

When possible provide them with options. Something as simple as, "which chair would you like to sit in", gives them some sense of control in their lives.
