## Weekly Offering

Many of our congregation use our printed and dated offering envelopes for their regular Sunday offering. They find the envelopes useful in helping them keep track of where they are up to, and provide greater privacy when they place their offering in the open plate.

Also, over 30 of our people or families have arranged for their regular offering to be Direct Debited from their bank accounts. The direct debits can be arranged weekly, fortnightly, monthly, etc., and can be date selected to suit you. People using this system find it useful not to have to remember to bring their offering each time—it is automatically debited from their nominated bank account and credited directly to the church.

## The Welcome Team

#### Why a Welcome Team?

The Western Heights congregation agreed that in the second year of our three year Strategic Plan we would formalise what we already try to do in welcoming newcomers. We aim to help visitors or potential new members feel they have come to a faith community that is "Warm and Welcoming".

#### Who are the Welcome Team?

#### What are the responsibilities of the Welcome Team?

The Welcome Team, in conjunction with the Greeters, has the responsibility of ensuring that visitors are warmly welcomed and given the opportunity for wider contact.

The Greeter's role is to identify visitors and those who come into our faith community for the first time.

Greeters then seek out a Welcome Team member and introduce the visitor or first time person.

The Welcome Team Member will invite the person/persons to sit to sit with them, or if for any reason this is not convenient, introduce them to someone else. After worship the Welcome Team Member will invite them to morning tea and introduce them to some other members of our Faith Community. If appropriate introduce both visitors and newcomers to Isabel, Karen or Audrey.

Offer a copy of the monthly newsletter and also invite them to fill in a Welcome Pew Card, either then, or to take one home to think about further.

Keep an eye open on subsequent Sundays for the returning newcomer. Maybe, if appropriate, invite them to meet up for a coffee.

To let Rev. Isabel Greenall know when a newcomer is showing signs of wanting to become a part of the WHUC faith community in an ongoing way. It would then be appropriate for a follow up cuppa to be arranged with other new-comers, one or two Welcome Team Members and the Leadership Advisory Team.

## **UCA Working With Children Checks**

All UCA congregations <u>are required by law</u> to ensure that the following members of the congregation have current Working With Children Checks (WWCC).

These include and are not limited to: Ministers, Lay Ministry Workers, Lay Preachers, Church Councillors, Worship Leaders, Music Leaders, Organists, Pianists, anyone commissioned by the Church Council to perform a leadership role, Bible Study Leaders, volunteers at Messy Church, those in leadership at Congregational Meetings. Volunteers at the Western Heights Secondary College Breakfast Program are also included.

Copies of the UCA letter from the General Secretary are available to all members of our congregation who are affected by this requirement. It is important that, if you are affected by this requirement, you get a WWCC or update your details immediately. Attached to this letter is a step-by-step procedure to guide those: (a) needing to make application for a WWCC for the first time, and (b) members of the congregation who are holders of current WWCC's and need to update their details.

Copies of the letter and the attached step-by-step guide are available from Karen Morgan.

The WWCC Regulations require Cardholders to update their details on the Dept. of Justice website. All locations where the person volunteers or is employed need to be recorded. Please update your details at http:// www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/home/cardholders/update+your+details/index.html. You must notify the Department of Justice and Regulation within 21 days of any changes to your personal, contact and organisation's details.

A very special thank-you to all our members who have already applied for and received a valid WWCC. These have now been entered onto the secure Synod database. Again, thank you. Karen Morgan
