#### **Reorganising the Worship Space**

Firstly, a big thanks to everyone for the feedback on reorganising the worship space on a Sunday morning so that it might better reflect the community that we are and would like to be. The suggestion from the Worship & Music Ministry Team is that we experiment with reorganising the worship space for June-August giving room for morning tea at the back and seating up the front for the service. This has been received well by the congregation as has been seen in the written feedback. There is a general buzz of "let's give it a go and see what happens".

Secondly, we make the changes <u>not</u> for the sake of making changes but because <u>we recognise that every aspect of</u> the life of our church community needs to reflect who we are today and where we are heading. Our purpose statement reminds us of this: loving God, growing together, partnering community and sharing faith. More particularly, six of the seven goals in our strategic plan are directly connected to what we do on a Sunday morning. Have a think about them.

The relevant goals are as follows: With God's help we will be a Church that:

- 1. Is intergenerational
- 2. Is welcoming, warm and inclusive
- 3. Encourages and supports exploring, sharing and growing in faith
- 4. Provides a variety of worship styles
- 5. Initiates and/or supports community action in areas of social justice and environmental sustainability
- 6. Cares for and responds to community and /or individual needs

Here are some questions to consider. Share your answers with your small group or with one or two others of your choosing.

- How do you see these goals at work in our gathering on a Sunday morning?
- How might meeting solely in the worship space contribute to achieving them?

What can we do to continue to grow to be the community we want to be on a Sunday morning?

Thirdly, the experiment will begin on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of June. During the week leading up to this, the Worship & Music Ministry Team with others will co-ordinate reorganising the space. If you'd like to be a part of this please let Isabel Greenall, Lynda Scott or Les Oliver know as soon as possible.

Fourthly, how are we going to measure the success of the experiment? Perhaps we use the goals as listed above?

Finally, we're on this journey together and so we need to work our way through the issues that arise together. In the first few weeks of the experiment in particular there will be issues that arise that we'll need to find creative solutions for. Let us all be on the lookout for what is happening and what we could do better.

## **Chapel Area Quiet Space**

Under the balcony, the chapel area has been set up as a quiet space. This is used regularly by the Tuesday night meditation group and is also available for anyone who is looking for a quiet place to go after worship. There are candles there for lighting or you are most welcome to simply "be".

# TV/DVD After Worship

As you face the front of the worship space, to the left a tv and dvd player have been set up for use after worship. Usually about 10mins after the service has finished a "Songs of Praise" dvd is turned on for anyone to enjoy.

# Summary of Minutes of Church Council (CC) Meeting

Weds., 18 April, 2018.

- 1. Devotions by Rev. Isabel G: We are called to look both back and forward. We look back at what God has done in the past. We look back at the stories of Jesus each Sunday. We look forward to reconciliation and renewal. We look forward with our Strategic Plan, to new things, with God's Spirit. Prayer.
- 2. Paul and Jenny Stephens have transferred to St. Luke's in Highton.
- 3. A morning tea will be held after church on 27 May to farewell Audrey Kateena.
- 4. The LAT revised guidelines were adopted.
- 5. CC Elections in June: A small task force has "reviewed the Ministry Teams model and changed/developed as needed to support the strategic plan". The suggested structure of 9 MT's was adopted by CC: Leadership Advisory Team LAT, Worship and Music, Pastoral Care, Messy Church, Resources & Hospitality, Small Groups, Safe Church, Finance, With Intention.
  - Each MT is asked to nominate one representative to CC for a period of 2 years.
  - If we get 9 MT reps, 2 reps from the congregation will be considered. CC elections will be held in June, at a date to be advised.
- 6. A small task force will be formed to develop the 3rd year of the Strategic Plan by the end of June, 2018.
- 7. Next monthly meeting of CC: Weds., 16 May, 2018.
