

Big News from Australia's Uniting Care Network

During the year UnitingCare VicTas had the opportunity to write a Tender for funding. Joanna Leece, Janet Pavlakis daughter, was the lead writer of this tender for funding from the Government.

In October 2021 UnitingCare Australia Nationally were selected to deliver a new program to help people escape family violence.

The Escaping Violence Payment program is funded by the Morrison Government as part of its 1.1 billion commitment in the 2021 - 2022 Federal Budget to help end violence against women and children.

Uniting National Director, Ms Little said, "Every person has the right to live in safety, with dignity and free from all forms of violence, including domestic, family and sexual violence. This payment will provide vital assistance to help those people who need financial support to leave."

Nine service agencies from the Australian UnitingCare Network across the country will deliver the program. UnitingVicTas are the lead agency with Joanna leading the establishment of this program with representatives from the National Uniting Network. The program commenced on 19th October 2021.
