Hi from your eco group

A couple of weeks ago, Bruce Waldron was asked to take on the role as coordinator from Chris Howard. This article is from Bruce, reprinted from the Geelong Zero Waste Facebook group. It has some good ideas.

I read the following comment in 'The Age' newspaper and it made me think of some other things we could do.

"If you want to reduce using soft plastics stop using plastic sandwich bags for school lunches. Buy a lunch box, wrap sandwiches in paper, fill a reusable drinking bottle with water and add a piece of fruit that comes in its own wrapper. It's not rocket surgery". John Bailey, Canterbury

In light of the collapse of the single use plastic shopping bag recycling program here are a few other suggestions as well.

- + Instead of using the thin plastic shopping bags when buying fruit and vegetables, use our 'Fruit and Veg' bags.
- + Instead of putting your fresh produce in the fridge in plastic bags, store them in our 'Fresh Food Storage bags'.
- + Instead of cling wrap or plastic sandwich bags use BeesWax Wraps.

We can show you how to make BeesWax Wraps but we also have the hand made, machine washable bags available for purchase at our next Repair Cafe Surf Coast event on December 4 at the Anglesea Memorial Hall.

A thoughtful and sustainable Christmas present for someone else, but a meaningful way to keep your own vegetables fresher for longer and reduce the number of trips to the shops.

If you are doing something a bit innovative in looking after the planet, do let Bruce know and he'll help find a way to share it.


