An embracing love, an abiding love, from the God of the universe enfolds all, from sunrise to sunset, and the darkness that follows.

Night too will pass.

Another day will dawn, seasons will turn still in the cycles of life and love.

A seasonal worker from Samoa died suddenly, and a service of remembrance and thanksgiving for other seasonal workers and related staff was held at Pilgrim Uniting Church in Launceston. Local minister Rev. Valentina Satvedi Leydon hosted, with Rev. Sani Vaeluaga and Rev. Temukisa Amituana'i-Vaeluaga travelling from Victoria to lead the service in Samoan. The dates of birth and death of the seasonal worker Puaa Taisi were noted as 'sunrise' and 'sunset'.

A Word from Temukisa

Part of my calling within the UCA is ministering outside of the local congregation.

Last Friday, with the blessing on the church council chair (Velma Oliver) on behalf of the CC and Congregation - I travelled with my husband to Launceston, responding to the call from the Pilgrim Church Minister and the Presbytery of Tasmanian Chairperson to assist with a memorial service for a Samoan Seasonal Worker who passed away tragically in December.

My husband and I lead the memorial service in Samoan and English for the non-English speakers from the employment sector and Pilgrim UC members and Presbytery chair. It was a lovely ministry to the grieving community who were so far from home. We appreciate the love and prayers of the WHUC.

Western Heights Uniting Tennis Club

The Tennis Club, in various names. Wellington St. Ashby, St James, Trinity, and now Western Heights Uniting, has existed since before 1940. The Premiership photos which were on the walls of the timber hall is testament to the dozens of Premierships teams, juniors and seniors, over the last 80+ years the club has been a credit to all involved, over many decades, but particularly the hard working leaders.

A few recent highlights are worth remembering

2014: To ensure the courts maintained the standards required, the Church Council provided a loan for Tennis Club for the resurfacing of the 4 courts in 2014, and the Tennis Club, to their credit, has since paid them back.

2018: The tennis rooms were renovated, for multi purpose use, with a total re paint, new glass sliding doors, carpeted, with a reverse cycle air conditioner, which has been much appreciated by the tennis club members. In approx 2019, this began being used by 4 GR, and plans are under way to explore ways in which the room can be shared, to enable the tennis community to use the room when not being used by 4GR

2019: To acknowledge the contributions of 4 long term members who had made major contributions to tennis generally and at Western Heights specifically, these 4 courts were named, recognising those members: Mark Wrigley, Bruce Rookes, Andrew Gibson, and Bruce Chisolm

2022: The local indoor centre, Centre Court Tennis, located in Hepner Place, North Geelong, for many years, has been sold, and closed. However, three of the teams from there, and one of the coaches have chosen to re locate to Western Heights

Teams: The club currently has 2 Senior teams, and 6 Junior Teams and 1 mid week team. approx 30 junior players and 16 senior players, plus family members—totalling approx 60 members. Team play on Saturdays: Juniors – mornings, Seniors – afternoon, and Tuesday mornings - mid week ladies

Family Club: the club has a history of encouraging parents, siblings, friends, grandparents, community members to watch, volunteers, support, enjoy their friends and family members, playing tennis to learn, to have fun, to improve, to play, to practice, to become a team member, to encourage others.

Current members learning, playing, practising, range in age from 10 to 70's.

Social Tennis: Thursday 10am – 12

Junior Practice: Wednesdays, and Thursdays 4-5.30-pm

Private Coaching: Monday, Tuesday and Friday afternoons

Beginner Program: a program designed for young beginner players (ages 7-9) has started on Friday evenings 4-5

Tennis Nights: The Club is hoping to organise some Family Tennis nights over the coming summer break

Welcoming New Arrivals: Most school holidays, the club has provided a program of 4 coaching sessions for high school aged new arrivals, recently Afghanistan, Syria, Lebanon, and finished with a BBQ for their families and the church community. Although Covid prevented this program to continue during 2020-22, the tennis club is exploring how it can continue in the future.
