Community Garden Update

The community garden officially launched in October last year is 'growing' gangbusters and already people have been actively engaged in planting produce; weeding plants; adding compost and monitoring water levels to keep everything thriving. A wide variety of vegetables have been planted to this point including tomatoes, lettuce, rhubarb, peppers and a variety of herbs.

The committee met for the first time in late January and warmly welcomed two new members, namely Sandra Neville and Robyn Howard to the team. As a group, they have set further goals for 2024 including more wicker beds; the introduction of security lighting as well as the commitment to build a wider network outside the immediate church community.

Funds from the initial Presbytery grant will be used to help purchase these additional items as well as 'grow' the garden in its endeavour to further partner with those in our neighbourhood.
