## 4gr

4gr is our main tenant, ... and over the coming months, we will be aiming to inform the church community some more about them, as we explore ways in which we can support one another.

4gr was started in August 2013 by our directors Gillian Baldwin and Beth Evans, who met working for a previous employer and realised they both shared a passion and a dream to ensure all members of our society experienced equality in employment.

They had to start with a name, so looking at those who inspired this "leap of faith" (their children), they decided on 4gr, which stands for "Four Good Reasons". Gill and Beth wanted to show their beautiful children that if you have a dream don't be afraid to go after it.

We support individuals from the ages of 15 to 60 who have a disability. The business has a dual focus, to train and coach individuals in the art of Job Seeking, and to work with business to ensure they have a healthy work environment where each individual is supported, where teams thrive, and each employee is valued.

4gr have been using space at the WHUC since 2015. At this time the business had to very quickly relocate due to flash flooding in Geelong. Gill approached Graeme to ask for a room to deliver the program. We started in the Minya room which we quickly outgrew and moved into the Horizon space, then the pandemic hit and we were afforded the opportunity to use the larger Badminton Hall so we could deliver the services while working in the government restrictions. Even though this space was appreciated, it was quite cold in the winter, so again the church committee allowed us to relocate back into the Horizon room, which the team were very pleased with. Without the ongoing support of the parishioners and church council we would be unable to offer our unique and vital services to those members of our community who are vulnerable and in need of specialised support to find and maintain employment.

4gr started with just Gill and Beth and in the past 10 years has grown to 22 staff which covers Barwon, Melbourne and South Australia and at the moment we have roughly 162 participants across the whole business who are being supported to find employment, have employment, or looking into courses.

We always welcome your questions and interest in what we do and would like to extend our sincere thanks for the support the entire **community** has shown us over the 8 years we have now been associated with WHUC.

It takes a village to raise a child, and it certainly takes a community to find that child employment.
