

Greater Geelong Steering Group meeting 20/10/2024

Attended by Glen Chidzey and Lynda Scott.

Each church took the opportunity to share news about what's going on in their congregations.

WHUC was able to share the news about our fair with regard to raising money, and the numbers of the public who came through our property.

Noble St are making the move to Wesley and their last service will be at the end of 2024 or thereabouts.

St Davids are finding their move to Geelong College very fruitful. Their numbers are healthy and the GC will be given first refusal on the purchase of the church property.

Grovedale are now working closely with Winchelsea UC.

They are also holding a very popular Makers Market once a month to help with their cash flow.

In table groups we discussed what the strategic plan might be for the UC in Greater Geelong. Some suggestions were

- "increasing trust" in the UC faith which appears to be lacking
- . actively welcoming members of the LGBTQI+ (eg St Albans holding "Pride" carols this year)
- . engage with the community more and leaving the boundaries of our churches
- . advocating for chaplaincy at Deakin uni where there is currently no UC (or other religious?) presence

Linley will be collating all that we have talked about over the last few years and will present us with a plan for the consideration of Church Council in the New Year.

Remember the "Kite Flying?"

It was earlier in 2024 that the congregation engaged in what we called "Kite Flying" or dreaming of what the ministry and mission of Western Heights could look like into the future. Three main areas to explore were voted for by the congregation.

Looking at how we could engage with refugees who live in and around Geelong.

Establishing a Playgroup.

Looking at how to expand interest in music exploring the talent that exists within the congregation and the tennis club and expanding that further into the community.

People interested in any of these three areas of ministry were listed on a sheet and we are all wondering "what's happening?"

As so many have been away in this last quarter of the year, it has been difficult to get people together. However, with regard to the establishment of a Playgroup, a small task group has met (Bianca Brandt, Janet Pavlakis and Jan Taylor) and plans are well on the way to establishing a playgroup for disabled children beginning at the end of February.

This will be held each Friday morning in the Horizons room from 10-11am and will be led by Bianca and her friend. However, in order to support these two leaders there will need to be one or two other people present each week. It is envisaged that we will provide morning tea to the parents and carers of the children.

This will be a new challenge for Western Heights but, if we are able to establish this ministry, we will be filling a gap that exists for these families. As Bianca has said, most outings for these families are for medical reasons and the opportunity for being able to share together in a relaxed atmosphere would be great. Note that all people who work in any way with children must have a "Working with Children Check" and this can easily be arranged. This is an exciting and important step for Western Heights to be taking and we look forward to flying with this.

Early in the new year a meeting will be convened for those whose names are on the Refugee and Music sheets to begin to explore these areas of ministry.

We are being called onward – already the Community Garden is flourishing in many ways, with some interest now being shown by people in the community. Members of the congregation are busy in and supporting the Tennis Club, and the eco group doing is engaged in important work; there is much happening.

Please uphold the mission and ministry of our Western Heights congregation in prayer.
