Following the closure of the Westlyn Evening Fellowship on 11th July 2012, there was a perceived desire for ladies to continue to have a time of fellowship together, so in 2013 the "Ladies Evening Fellowship" group, led by Helen Sleep and Joan Murphy, was born, meeting at 6.30pm at the Listening Post.


Spiritual Care at University Hospital and MacKellar Centre, Geelong

The Presbytery currently provides 2 days per week (Monday & Friday) of spiritual care to the greater Geelong community based at University Hospital, Geelong. Rev Isabel Greenall is in the Placement offering care and support to patients and staff primarily at the hospital but also to those at the Mackellar Centre, as needed.

Historically, the Uniting Church chaplain has been able to access a list of all Uniting Church patients and visit them. However, with recent review of procedures alongside privacy legislation, it is no longer possible to do this. The process now is that a patient will need to ask their nurse or another member of the ward staff for a visit from the Uniting Church chaplain or Spiritual Care team. They will then put in a referral requesting a visit.

For family members, congregation members and Ministers, sometimes you may know someone in hospital that might need some care during their admission. The most important thing is that you ask for their permission before letting Isabel or the Spiritual Care team know. If the patient is not able to give their own consent, it needs to then come from the next of kin.

Combined Refugee Action Group in Geelong

Dear Members of Western Heights UC Congregation,

The incoming Executive of the Combined Refugee Action Group in Geelong (CRAG) met in late November 2024, and in looking at the year ahead, realise that we need help.

There are many groups and individuals in the community who have either ceased supporting the Refugee cause, or believe that ongoing advocacy and direct help is no longer required.

In fact, there are more than 8000 Asylum seekers in Australia who are still in limbo – either refused visas due to the unfair 'Fast Track' system, or are still awaiting decisions from Courts or the Minister for Immigration.

Our Mission is far from over.

To abandon the Refugee cause now would be abandoning the target group which needs our help more than ever before. Can you imagine how it must feel to have lived here for 10, 11, 12 or more years, contributed to the community and still be unsure whether you can stay?

To this end, CRAG Executive members are calling on you to help us in our fight for refugee justice.

Any past contribution to help our Refugee and Asylum seeker friends has been highly valued and we want you to continue for their sake. If you are not already a member of CRAG we encourage you to join us. We meet monthly at 5.30pm at the Geelong Trades Hall, 127 Myers Street Geelong, and would welcome any member of your congregation who would like to come to those meetings.

Will you consider the important life issues continuing to be faced by those seeking asylum and permanent refugee status, and living in our Geelong region, and join us in helping them?
