Summary of Church Council Minutes of 19th February 2025.

- Devotions by Temukisa, Loving God the "Ministry of Noticing" -challenging us to notice and actively care for others .
- The ability of our equipment to live stream a service into our worship space has now been confirmed. Additionally the sound system has been fitted with new speakers to improve sound quality.
- Lynda Scott will be asking for more people to up-skill to operate the data and sound systems .
- An information board detailing Easter services has been erected at the front of the church. .
- Church Council agreed that for Temukisa's 6 week long service leave/annual leave, we would cover our own ministry needs internally rather than apply for a presbytery supply minister.
- The congregational secretary will purchase sympathy cards as required and be reimbursed by the treasurer. .
- Each of the "Kite flying" groups will be asked to provide a written report on their progress to the next CC meeting.
- In the event that we cannot fulfil the IT role for funerals, the funeral director will be asked to provide a suitable person. .
- The CC of St Lukes have requested an informal meeting with WHUC CC. Date to be decided. .
- A summary of the recent survey will be distributed.

Summary of Church Council Minutes of 19th March 2025.

- Devotions by Glenn Chidzey .
- The suggestions from our church review have been collated and discussed. The results to be published in the monthly along with the numbers of people who made the suggestions. Hard copies to be made available. The suggestions will be actioned starting with the highest numbers .
- Three of our congregation members have been nominated to join Church Council.
- Kite flying progress will be presented to the congregation at the AGM .
- A meeting with the church council of St Lukes has been held. We found it useful to gain a greater understanding of their struggles and their missional work. Another meeting has been requested.
- The ministers report confirmed that all services to be held while Temukisa is on long service leave (5/5-15/6) will be conducted by various church members or groups within our own church, with the exception of the combined Pentecost service and the Uniting Church's birthday service.

WORSHIP. Possibility of merging with another congregation (3)

Professor Michael Clarke



Emeritus Professor Mike Clarke is a zoologist who has studied the ecology and conservation biology of birds, reptiles, mammals, fish and plants. He leads research at La Trobe University, along with his colleagues Profs Andrew Bennett and Jim Radford into the impact of fire on fauna. He also maintains an ongoing research interest in threatened species and threatening processes. He was the Convener of the Scientific Advisory Committee on the *Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act* to the Victorian Minister for the Environment for five years. In 2007 he was awarded the DL Serventy Medal by the Royal Australasian

Ornithologists Union for his outstanding contribution to the scientific literature in ornithology. In 2010 he was an expert witness in fire ecology at the Victorian Bushfires Royal Commission. He was the Head of the School of Life Sciences from 2011-2019. In 2014 his research on fire ecology with Prof Bennett was one of three finalists for a Eureka Prize in Environmental Research. In 2023 he was elected as a Fellow of Birdlife Australia, the highest award available in the discipline, for distinguished service to omithology. He remains actively involved in research and ensuring conservation policy is based on the best available evidence. He recently served as a member of the Board of Directors of Parks Victoria for three and half years. He is a Fellow of ISCAST (Christianity and Science in Conversation). https://scholars.latrobe.edu.au/mfclarke
