LUKE 19: 28-40 [NRSV/adapted]

Jesus went on ahead of the disciples, heading towards Jerusalem. As they were approaching Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of the disciples on ahead, saying, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. 'Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say, 'The Anointed One needs it.' So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, 'Why are you untying the colt?' 'The Anointed One needs it', they replied. Then the disciples brought the colt to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt's back, they set Jesus on it. As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, all the disciples began to praise God enthusiastically for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, 'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!' Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Teacher, order your disciples to stop.' Jesus answered, 'I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out.'
