

Lamentations 3:19-26

The thought of my affliction and my homelessness is wormwood and gall! My soul continually thinks of it and is bowed down within me. So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, 'We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!" "
