"The Magnificat sings it: 'Mary, did you know, that your baby boy is Lord of all creation? ... This sleeping child you're holding is the great 'I am!'

End Child Poverty Update

The data is in. Australia is on track to reach *1 million children living in poverty*, with a 33% increase in just the four years.

That's *another 237,000 Australian* children missing out on meals or living in crowded housing or homeless.

Bankwest Curtin Economics Centre (BCEC) has just released the Child Poverty in Australia Report for the End Child Poverty campaign, and its damning:



950,000 children living in poverty in 2025

Single-parent families hardest hit: 36.6% living in poverty

Poverty is not just about income—children face food insecurity, poor housing, and limited access to education and healthcare

Children report skipping meals, sleeping on floors, and being punished for torn uniforms.

Feelings of isolation and stress replace confidence and connection.

Poverty impacts health, education, and future opportunities.

This report is more than data - it's a call to action. Together, we can push for a child-centred definition of poverty, stronger legislation, and policies that put children first.
